



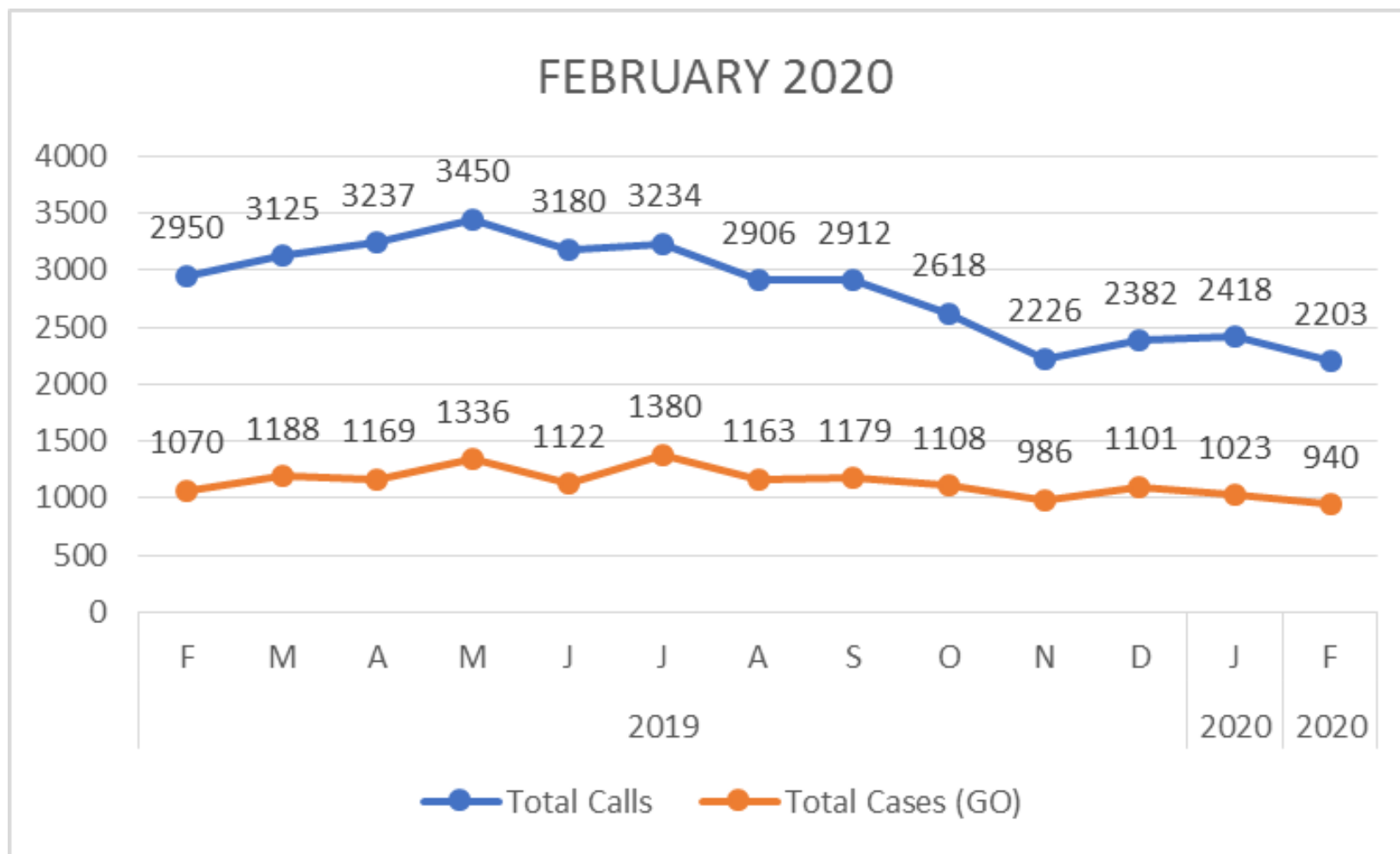

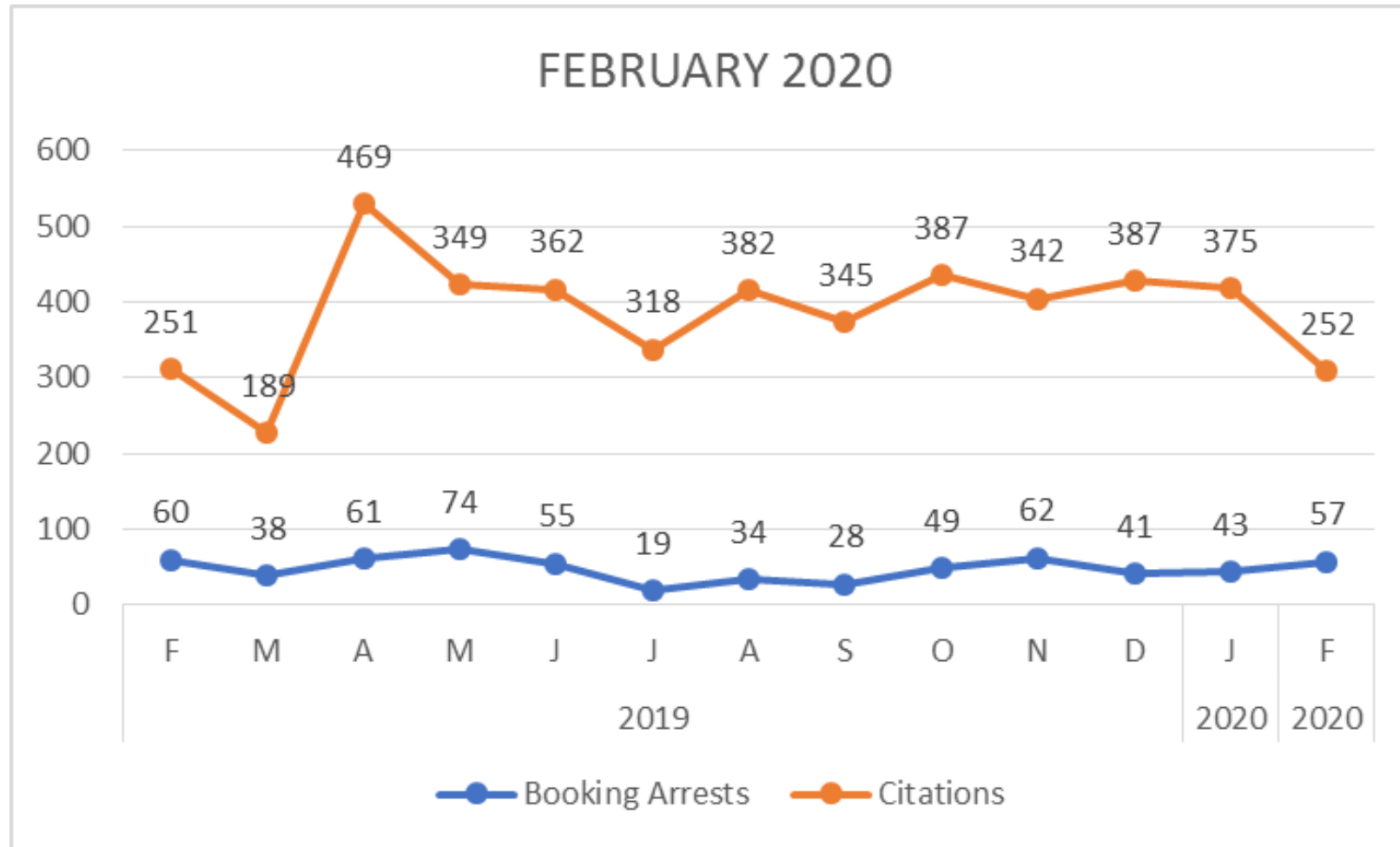

# MILLCREEK STREET CRIMES



Millcreek Detectives received intel on two suspects involved in multiple burglaries which have occurred in Millcreek going back as far as November. Through investigation, suspect have been identified. Search warrants were obtained and served. Several sentimental and irreplaceable items have been recovered. Investigation is still on going.



# Community Crime Suppression Unit



- CCSU combined with DEA Metro Narcotics served a federal warrants in Millcreek ; which stemmed from a traffic stop conducted by CCSU. The results of the warrant produced 2 pounds of Heroin 50,000 dollars in cash and 1 gun. Arrests were made. On going investigation.
- 4 warrants served; stolen property, drug possession, drug distributing.
- 3 stolen vehicle recovered each with arrests: (2 parole fugitives. 1 incident involved stolen mail of over 73 victims; which ranged from Ogden, Park City and Millcreek. Suspect arrested and numerous charges filed).



# E.A.S.Y (Eliminating Alcohol Sales to Youth)



- COP Detectives along with Covert Underage Buyers (CUB's) conducted EASY operations.
- The E.A.S.Y. Law limits youth access to alcohol in grocery and convenience stores, authorizes law enforcement to conduct random alcohol sales compliance checks, requires mandatory training for each store employee that sells beer or directly supervises the sale of beer and funds a statewide media and education campaign to alert youth, parents, and communities of the dangers of alcohol to the developing teen.
