The study shows that should Millcreek remain in the MSD, it would pay \$108 for every \$100 of services it receives. If Millcreek were to leave the MSD but contract directly with Salt Lake County for all services, it would have an extra \$6 to spend for every \$100 it pays for services. That means Millcreek has the flexibility to provide some of its own services, such as planning and economic development.

BST Trail Work Day Volunteers Needed

MILLCREEK. Our City enjoys the beauty of easy access to Mt. Olympus and other trails along the Wasatch Front. The Bonneville Shoreline Trail Committee is working on the newest segment of the BST on the western slope of Mount Olympus, connecting the Mt. Olympus trail with Heugh's Canyon.

Volunteers are needed from 8am-1pm tomorrow (May 6), and again on May 20 and June 2d, to help maintain and protect these amenities. Join the BST on one or more of those days. The fun begins at the Mount Olympus Trailhead near Pete's Rock.

Pre-registration at www.bonnevilleshorelinetrail.org is required. Additional location details, instructions and parking information will be emailed to registered participants. Volunteers will be doing trail work, involving removing roots and rocks and clearing vegetation from the trail alignment. Bring sturdy boots or shoes, work gloves, long pants, sun protection, and a water bottle.

All necessary tools and instruction will be provided, as will a light breakfast. Participants must be 13 years or older for trail work. All minors must be accompanied by an adult.

I-80 PLAN AHEAD

Lane/Ramp Closures for Foothill and Parleys Canyon Area

UDOT will be repairing bridges in the Foothill Drive/Parleys Canyon area along I-80 and I-215. The construction work on these bridge decks and substructures will necessitate lane closures and detours. This UDOT project will preserve infrastructure and optimize mobility along I-80, one of Utah's most heavily traveled freeways.


Ramp Closures Beginning Monday, May 8th: Westbound I-80 to northbound Foothill Drive/Parleys Way (ramp), will be closed from May 8th through mid-July.

Eastbound I-80 to northbound Foothill Drive (Loop Ramp), will be closed from May 8th through mid-September.

Lane Restrictions Beginning Monday, May 8th: Access to northbound Foothill Drive from I-215 will be reduced to one-lane, expect delays and follow the detour route. From May 8th through mid-Sept.

UDOT'S CLIFF NOTES TO THIS PROJECT:

Improvements to Foothill Drive Northbound I-80 Ramps: The project will improve the merge area for traffic exiting Eastbound I-80. UDOT will be shifting traffic slightly and striping an auxiliary lane between the I-80 Eastbound off ramp to Foothill Drive and the off ramp to Parleys Way. This should help improve functionality and flow for the Northbound Foothill Drive ramp.

Foothill Drive will be re-restriped and pushed to the west side of Foothill Drive. There will be a 2' shoulder and 11' lanes to access the southbound ramp. Access will be open to both lanes on Foothill Drive and then all three lanes when Parleys Way merges to Foothill Drive. There will be intermittent lane closures at night which are allowed in the specs from 8 PM to 8 AM.

Texas Turnaround for Detour at 3300 South: The detour route at 3300 South/I-215 will be striped and have detour barricading directing traffic through a u-turn back north onto the I-215 northbound on-ramp without any delays or waits at the traffic signal.

At the conclusion of the citizen comment time, the chair may direct staff to assist the citizen on the issue presented; direct the citizen to the proper administrative department(s); or take no action. This policy also applies to all public hearings. Citizens may also submit written requests (outlining their issue) for an item to be considered at a future council meeting. The chair may place the item on the agenda under citizen comments; direct staff to assist the citizen; direct the citizen to the proper administrative departments; or take no action.
